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A Rich Curriculum

An innovative approach

We have been been developing an alternative approach to the teaching of the full range of primary school subjects in such a way as to make the most of the breadth and depth of the National Curriculum.



This year, from Year 1 upwards, we are approaching each year group's curriculum as a story, which will unfold across the year, chapter by chapter, as subjects are given deep focus in sequence rather than in a weekly spread of short sessions.

The children will share their learning at points across the year - sometimes inviting other classes to come and learn from them, and hosting exposés periodically for parents. Dates for the exposés will be published on the school calendar shortly.

The stories are about to be published on our website; the themes for each year group are:

Year 1 - In My Life

Year 2 - What a wonderful world!

Year 3 - Zero to Hero - from matter to magic and mirrors

Year 4 - Contrast - The Good, the Bad and the Ugly

Year 5 - Survival of the Fittest - but at what cost?

Year 6 - Fragile Earth
