Science Talkabout - Make your own sundial!

Perhaps you would like to share the wonder of the movement of the Earth - how incredible that this vast planet rotates, taking us through each day from dawn to dusk!

Find a sunny area (quickly, before the sunshine disappears again!)

Push one end of a long stick (about 60cm long, ideally) into the ground, leaning slightly to the north. (Help your child figure out which way that would be!)

Place a pebble where the end of the shadow falls, on the hour, each hour, for as long as you can manage it during the day. See what your child notices about the way the shadow moves. It's a great way to explore 'clockwise' and 'anti-clockwise', along with left, right and the points of the compass.
