Science Talkabout...

Autumn offers a feast of fascination at our feet!

You might want to talk this process through with your children the following might be helpful.

Look closely, the leaves are drying out, turning red, orange, gold.... and falling...

Why?

Leaves make the food for the tree. Leaves contain chlorophyll, a chemical that helps to turn the sunlight into food. Chlorophyll makes the leaves green.

In winter, there isn't enough sunlight to make food, the tree no longer needs the chlorophyll and the green colour disappears. The orange and red chemicals were there all the time and now the green has gone, these are the colours we see.

But does this happen to every tree? If not, why not?

Find some leaves and bring them into school!

Keep using the 'What kind of...?" question to take your curiosity deeper!
