Morning Snack and Lunches

Snack

- Children can bring in a piece of fruit from home for morning break. A selection of fruit is available at break at a cost of 30p.

Year 3 - Age Related Expectations

- The National Curriculum outlines expectations a child should meet each year.
- Any extra support you can provide in helping your child to achieve these expectations is greatly valued.

Over the summer please work on the following with your child:

Reading

- Encourage your child to read a range of fiction, poetry, plays, and non-fiction texts. Encourage your child to read aloud as much as possible.
- *Gadgeteers* is the theme of this year's national Summer Reading Challenge that runs during the school summer holidays at all libraries.

Spellings

- Practise Year 1 /2 spellings and common exception words (CEW), including many of those on the Year 3/4 word list.

Maths

- Read, count and order numbers up to 1000.
- Recall and use multiplication facts for 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 multiplication tables.
- Practise telling the time using 12 hour and 24 hour clocks.

Literacy

READING

The children engage in daily reading in various ways, including the use of Class Readers. Parts of these books and the curriculum booklets will be read chorally by the children, some read individually and other parts will be read by the class teacher. We discuss of the meaning of words and question understanding of the text.

WRITING


In the Autumn term, we are focusing on planning, drafting and orally rehearsing writing, including selecting vocabulary and phrases to interest the reader

We are also exploring the Talk for Writing approach to writing, which involves making learning visual, as well as the process of imitating, innovating and inventing for Year 3.

Structured handwriting sessions are delivered each week. During these sessions, we explore grammar and various spelling patterns.

Maths

- Numbers to 1000
- Addition and Subtraction
- Multiplication and Division
- Further Multiplication and Division
- Length
- Mass
- Volume
- Fractions
- Angles
- Lines and Shapes
- Perimeter of Figures



Children are encouraged to use equipment, such as Diennes and counters during maths lessons to aid their understanding.

From Zero to Hero

The Year 3 curriculum story provides a narrative that captures the children's interest and allows them to consider the topics presented to them through the lens, 'From Zero to Hero'.

- Seesaw – A maths, reading/writing, times tables and spelling activity will be uploaded on to Seesaw every Monday afternoon. Please upload any completed work by Sunday evening.
