POLICY FOR ALLOCATION OF MAINSITE/ANNEXE

1. The Governors consider any exceptional medical and/or social needs which would affect a child's placement. This may on occasion override all other considerations. They may allocate a site on this basis (including looked after children).
2. The admissions criteria is followed, forming a priority order:

Mainsite

- Priority is given to Catholic children who have a sibling connection at the time of admission, living in Our Lady of Pity Parish (Greasby, Frankby and Irby).
- Catholic children living in Our Lady of Pity Parish (Greasby, Frankby and Irby).
- Catholic children living in St Agnes's Parish with a sibling connection at the time of admission.
- Catholic children living in St Agnes's Parish.
- Catholic children living in St Catherine's Parish with a sibling connection at the time of admission.
- Catholic children living in St Catherine's Parish.
- Catholic children out of area with a sibling connection at the time of admission.
- Catholic children out of area.
- Non-Catholic children with a sibling connection at the time of admission, living in Our Lady of Pity, St Agnes or St Catherine's Parish.
- Non-Catholic children living in Our Lady of Pity, St Agnes or St Catherine's Parish.
- Non-Catholic children out of area with a sibling connection at the time of admission.
- Non-Catholic children out of area.

- Catholic children living in St Catherine's Parish.
- Catholic children living in St Agnes's Parish.
- Catholic children living in Our Lady of Pity Parish.
- Catholic children out of area.
- Non-Catholic children living in St Catherine's Parish.
- Non Catholic children living in St Agnes's Parish.
- Non-Catholic children living in Our Lady of Pity Parish.
- Non-Catholic children out of area.

If any category is oversubscribed, ie there are more applicants than places available, then priority will be given on the basis of distance from home to the site in question. Distance will be measured as the shortest walking distance from the front door of the child's home address (including flats) to the main entrance of the site using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system, in the case of the mainsite and google maps for the Annexe, with those living nearer to the site having priority. In the event of distances being the same for 2 or more applicants where this distance would be the last place/s to be allocated, a random lottery will be carried out in a public place. All the names will be entered into a hat and the required number of names will be drawn out. Parents need to be aware that places may be offered at either site according to the site allocation policy.
